<p>In the framework of the implementation of its NAPA, the Government of The Gambia has sought UNDP support to develop and submit to the LDCF a project proposal titled: <i>"Enhancing Resilience Of Vulnerable Coastal Areas And Communities To Climate Change In The Republic Of Gambia"</i>. The Republic of the Gambia is a LDC Party to the UNFCCC and has completed its NAPA and is thus eligible for project funding under the LDCF. Submission to the GEF under the LDCF started with a submission by the GEF implementing agency chosen by the LDC of a Project Identification Form (PIF), including a project preparation grant (PPG). After the PIF was approved by the LDCF/SCCF Council, the GEF agency then employed Jonathan McCue to help support the LDC to develop the project fully into a detailed Project Document (ProDoc) and a Request for GEF CEO Endorsement.</p> <p>The objective of the developed project is to reduce Gambia's vulnerability to sea-level rise and associated impacts of climate change by improving coastal defences and enhancing adaptive capacities of coastal communities. The expected output of this project are: (i) Policies, institutions and individuals mandated to manage coastal areas strengthened to reduce the risks of climate change; (ii) Vulnerability of coastal investments to climate risks reduced through the design, construction and maintenance of coastal protection measures and; (iii) Rural livelihoods in the coastal zone enhanced and protected from the impacts of climate change through the demonstration and the transfer of successful coastal adaptation technologies and the introduction of economic diversification.</p>					<p>The actual services of the contract for the Team Leader included work towards developing the Project Document (ProDoc) for the US\$8.9m GEF project. The services involved the following activities:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Collect and review climate change and coastal change information. 2. Consult with the key Gambian stakeholders and donor agencies, various line Ministries and devolved agencies on the project logistics, design, and results in order to comprehensively detail the required Prodoc. 3. Carryout stakeholder consultation at possible target intervention sites and evaluate and determine suitable intervention sites. 4. Agree and detail the objectives, risks, scope, logistics and personnel requirements for the Prodoc. 5. Control quality and provide technical clearance of inputs and outputs of all the other international / national consultants subcontractors. 6. Define the logical framework plan and budget for the project and the additionality of proposed outcomes and activities. 7. Carryout workshops in order to disseminate the approaches developed by the project and to validate the ProDoc prior to submission to the GEF-LDCF Board.
