Detailed description of project

The German Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) supported the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) through a €2.9 million *Coastal Protection for Climate Change Adaptation in the Small Island States in the Caribbean* Project over the next 5 years. The Project seeks to pursue the implementation of Local Adaptation Measures (LAMs) for the sustainable improvement of coastal ecosystems relevant for climate change adaptation in Grenada, Jamaica, Saint Lucia, and Saint Vincent and the Grenadines. The design of the Project is based on an agreement made between KfW (the German Development Bank) and the Caribbean Community Climate Change Centre (CCCCC) through the CARICOM Secretariat.

The Caribbean Community Climate Change Centre (CCCCC), with financial assistance from the German Development Bank (KfW), contracted the services of at three (3) Individual Consultants to assist the CCCCC in the selection of the best proposals received under our Call for Proposals <CfPs/LAMs/01-15> Local Adaptation Measures Grant Scheme and to achieve a transparent, high-quality, complete and coherent selection process of projects, which are in line with the criteria set out in the Guidelines for Applicants.

In July 2015 a call for project concepts was launch targeting eligible entities in the four (4) participating countries of Jamaica, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Saint Lucia, and Grenada. Further to the evaluation of these Concept Notes a total of nine (9) applications were preselected. These preselected entities have been invited to prepare and submit full project proposals building on their Concept Notes

Type of services provided

Jonathan McCue (on behalf of Sustainable Seas Ltd) carried out the following main tasks :

1. Undertake confidential assessments for the Project Implementation Unit (PIU)/CCCCC consistent with the published evaluation grid covering core perspectives;
2. Ensure that the information provided in assessments reports are logical and coherent and provides a clear basis for/of the proposed recommendation;
3. Clearly state recommendations for each Application assessed in one (1) of three (3) categories; rejected, accepted, or provisionally accepted; and
4. Re-assess proposals (if required) and as instructed by the Evaluation Committee be available to participate (virtually) as part of Evaluation Committee meetings to address specific questions that may be asked by the Evaluation Committee.
