<p>The United Nations Development Programme and Global Environment Facility - Pacific Adaptation to Climate Change project is a five year regional programme on climate change adaptation, which began implementation in February 2009. The project is executed by SPREP, who work directly with and 14 Pacific Island Countries.</p> <p>In November 2012, a Mid-term Review of the PACC project was carried out which included Cook Islands. The assessments looked at all aspects of the project; Component 1 Mainstreaming, Component 2 Pilot Demonstrations, Component 3 Knowledge Management and Communications and Component 4 Project Management. The findings of the MTE recommended that there is a need to prepare a coastal zone management, development and adaptation strategy for Mangaia; with the harbor re-development plan as a major integral part. An immediate establishment and operation of environmental monitoring program over the coastal area and harbor site; with baseline and historic record established.</p> <p>In February 2013, the Cook Islands project management team attended a workshop in Samoa on strategic planning re assessing the linkages of the project goals and objectives to national strategic plans and programs. At this workshop, annual work plans and logical frameworks were re-assessed and refined for 2013 and 2014. Part of the 2014 work plan activities include the development of a coastal management policy specific for the outer island of Mangaia, and that encapsulates recommendations of the mid-term review and achieves the mainstreaming outcome of the project.
