The project "Building the Capacity of the Lao PDR Government to Advance the National Adaptation Planning Process" helps to deliver this Roadmap. It was approved by the Global Environment Fund on December 2020 with a GEF grant of US\$ 3,5 million. The objective of the project is to strengthen the institutional and technical capacity of stakeholders and the government to advance the NAP process. Such strengthening will be achieved through four components, namely: i) institutional and technical capacity for the NAP process in Lao PDR; ii) climate information systems for prioritizing adaptation needs; iii) social and economic development in Lao PDR that integrates adaptation to climate change; and iv) monitoring, reviewing and reporting on the NAP process in Lao PDR.					Deliverables include a series of final Situational Sector Statement to support a parallel Climate Vulnerability Risk Assessment (CVRA revisions to national, sectoral and provincial strategies and development plans made to integrate CCA priorities and support towards the submission of final NAP report. Support also included missions to Laos to help guide the PMU and offer advice to national consultants, the PMU and Project Steerin Committee. Advice and guidance in the writing of the NAP iwas also a key aspect of the project.			

The role as Chief Technical Advisor (CTA) is participatory and fully inclusive over the period of the project. The main objective of the CTA was to support the Govt of Laos (MoNRE) to help the country produce a Laos National Adaptation Plan (NAP) document based on contributions from the NAP project team, its national and international consultants and Laos NAP key stakeholders.
