<p>Indonesia is blessed with the most significant stretch of coral reef in the world, making it a habitat of thousands of fish species. With the highest diversity, including some 83 coral genes and 570 fish species, the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) has designated Indonesia, part of the Coral Triangle, as the centre of the world's marine biodiversity.</p> <p>The responsibility of the International Consultant is to work with the GoI and other stakeholders, with the support of UNDP, to scope and then develop a project proposal that would be eligible for the funding under the Global Environment Facility (GEF-8) and is technically feasible/attractive according to GEF and UNDP criteria. The range of focus areas cover number of activities, not be limited to coral reef-related issues, (e.g., coral reef rescue, partnership for coral reef financing and insurance in Asia/the Pacific/global, and aquaculture), innovative financial facility for environment/biodiversity, relevant legal and regulatory improvements and capacity building activities, and blue economy concepts as could be applicable in the sector.</p> <p>Key activities include Review relevant background documents on current baseline situation (reports, plans, acts, legislation, procedures, studies/assessments) related to coral reef protection and conservation, climate change mitigation marine biodiversity protection within the concept of blue economy.
